

Do not wait until you unexpectedly come home to a hot house or you get a high summer electric bill...make sure now that your AC unit will be ready when you need it. Below are a few ways to keep your HVAC system running efficiently this summer season:



- Make sure you have a HVAC professional service your system regularly, and request that they clean the condensing coils.
- Operate the cooling equipment wisely. To get the most out of your AC unit, operate it on a conservative temperature setting. Experts recommend keeping your thermostat on 78 degrees during the summer months. You should set it at an even higher temperature when nobody is at home.
- Change the filters regularly; consider once per month during peak usage. Dirty filters can restrict the airflow through your system, reduce efficiency and lead to other problems.
- Do not close off areas of your home unless there is a return vent in that area. The system must be able to completely circulate air.
- Allow for the airflow around the outdoor unit. Provide at least two feet of clearance on all sides and five feet at the top of the unit for proper ventilation.

By following these simple tips, you can help improve the overall efficiency of your AC system and lower your home's energy usage this summer. As a Sawnee EMC member, you have a unique opportunity to support Operation Round Up, a program that provides financial support to 501 (c) (3) charitable organizations, local teacher classroom grants, and youth scholarships within the communities served by Sawnee EMC. All of this from members simply "rounding up" their power bill.


Participating in the Sawnee Foundation's Operation Round Up Program is <u>voluntary</u>; and the average contribution per member is only about \$6 per year. For example, if your electric bill is \$98.76, and you participate in Operation Round Up, your bill would be rounded up to \$99.00, and 24 cents would go directly to the Foundation and donated to charity. Monthly donations can be as little as one penny or as much as \$1.

In the first quarter of 2024, the Sawnee Electric Membership Foundation gifted \$27,590 to the following charitable organizations:



The Sawnee Electric Foundation also provided \$2,876.94 to local area teachers at Avery Elementary School and Settles Bridge Elementary School, through the Bright Ideas Program, to implement programs and classroom projects that otherwise may not have received funding. Lastly, the Foundation was able to provide \$10,000 to help fund scholarships at the University of North Georgia – Cumming Campus which is served by Sawnee EMC.
