LIGHTING:

One of the easiest ways to reduce energy usage is by upgrading your lighting.

- Switch to LED bulbs in frequently used fixtures. They're now more affordable than ever, consume less energy than traditional incandescent bulbs, and last much longer.
- For outdoor lights, consider installing photocell units that automatically activate when it gets dark.
- Motion sensor lights can be a great addition, too. Combining a motion sensor with a photocell unit provides an excellent energy-saving solution.

HEATING AND COOLING:

Keeping comfortable while minimizing energy waste is crucial, especially in the colder months.

- Proper insulation in areas like the attic and crawl space can make a huge difference in your home's temperature regulation. Sawnee EMC even offers a rebate for attic insulation upgrades.
- Doors are often a source of air leaks use weather stripping to seal them properly.
- Be sure to clean or replace your HVAC filters regularly, ideally once a month.
- When not in use, close fireplace dampers to prevent heat from escaping into the chimney.





Here's WATTS Cookin' **Almond Flour Banana Bread**

Ingredients:

3 eggs

3 mashed bananas

1 tablespoon vanilla extract

2 tablespoons honey

2 cups almond flour

1 tablespoon cinnamon

1 teaspoon baking soda

dash of salt



Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Whisk together eggs, mashed bananas, vanilla, and honey in a bowl. Gradually whisk in the almond flour, cinnamon, salt, and baking soda until smooth. Add in optional chocolate chips, walnuts, etc.

Transfer batter to a baking pan lined with parchment paper. Bake for 40 - 50 minutes.
