Remove Clutter in the New Year with Sawnee EMC's Paperless Billing

Sawnee EMC is here to help you get organized in the new year with paperless billing. Did you know that you can receive an email or text message when your Sawnee EMC billing statement is ready? This program is called "eBill", and it simply means Sawnee EMC will let you know as soon as your bill has been generated. You simply click the link, within the email or text we send, to see your bill. No more waiting for it to arrive in the mail.

Paperless billing **does not** mean you have to change your current payment method. If you receive an eBill notification from Sawnee EMC, you can still pay by any method you would like, including writing a check. Paperless billing lets you know immediately when your billing statement is ready. In fact,

you can receive a paper bill **and** an eBill notification to try it out and then discontinue the paper bill when you are ready. It is safe and secure. If you try it, we are certain you will like it.

Signing up for paperless billing and receiving an email or text each month could not be easier. STATEMENT OF NONDISCRIMINATION**

About Operation Round Up

Attic Insulation, A Year-Round Energy Improvement

In the attic of your home, an insulation level of R-49 aids in creating a strong thermal barrier that slows heat transfer between the living space and the outdoors. During the winter, attic insulation keeps warm conditioned air inside the home, thereby reducing the workload on the heating system. During the summer, attic insulation prevents warm, unconditioned attic air from entering the home, thus allowing the air conditioning unit to operate more efficiently. This level of attic insulation can help to lower energy consumption and improve indoor comfort year-round.

However, insulation alone is not enough. Air sealing is essential to stopping drafts and preventing conditioned air from escaping to the outdoors through vulnerable exposures in the building envelope of the home. Without proper air sealing, even high-quality insulation loses effectiveness. Together, R-49 attic insulation and air sealing improve energy efficiency, protect the home from moisture problems, and can increase the overall durability and value of the home.

Sawnee EMC is here to help! We offer an energy rebate of ½ the cost, up to \$200, for improving your existing attic insulation to an R-49 level or greater in homes built prior to 2021. This rebate is given as a bill credit. Contact one of our highly trained and professional Energy Services Representatives to discuss the options that could help lower energy bills for years to come.

Here's WATTS Cookin' Pineapple Barbecue Chicken

Ingredients:

1 pound (4 oz. each) boneless, skinless chicken breasts
Salt and fresh ground pepper, to taste
1/2 cup of barbecue sauce
1 can (20 oz.) pineapple chunks, drained
1/2 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil

Directions:

Season chicken breasts with salt and pepper. Grease a baking dish with cooking spray. Arrange chicken in baking dish and top with 1/3 of the barbecue sauce; rub in the barbecue sauce and top with pineapple chunks. Add remaining barbecue sauce on top and cover with plastic wrap. Place it in refrigerator for 30 minutes to 2 hours. When ready to bake, preheat oven to 400°F. Remove plastic wrap. Drizzle olive oil over chicken. Bake uncovered for 40 minutes or until chicken's internal temperature reads 165°F. Remove from oven and serve.
